PART D TERMS OF REFERENCE / SCOPE OF WORK

1. BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION


The Water Research Commission (WRC) is a national entity established in terms of the Water Research Act (Act No 34 of 1971), to coordinate and fund water research in South Africa.

The WRC requires to appoint coaches for the provision of coaching service to the WRC employees.

According to the World Economic Forum, employees resigned in huge numbers over the last year as a result of burnout, endless stress, and the dramatic blurring of lines separating work and personal life. These factors caused many to deeply contemplate the values they want to maintain in their lives, and how they want to live and work moving forward.

Workplace culture played a crucial role in their choice to resign. Employees operating in toxic work environments, or in environments in which they felt uncared for contributed to, high anxiety, lower ability to handle change and a loss on interest in the work currently being done.

Data published by MIT Sloan in January 2022 indicated that a toxic workplace was far and away – by nearly three times to mental health issues and resignations. Every single day, millions of employees are working in these unhealthy and toxic work environments. Overlaid onto this are the aforementioned impact of COIVD. Millions of workers are grieving, while also managing the stressors that come from a toxic work environment.



How does the organization support employees:

Step One - Helping Employees as individuals build emotional resilience to respond and cope with the tough situations (coaching).

Benefits of Coaching:

Coaching in organization and leadership settings is also an invaluable tool for developing people across a wide range of needs. The benefits of coaching are many; 80% of people who receive coaching report increased self-confidence, and over 70% benefit from improved work performance, relationships, and more effective communication skills. 86% of companies report that they recouped their investment on coaching and more (source: Internal Coaching Federation 2009).

Coaching provides an invaluable space for personal development. For example, managers are frequently presented with employees struggling with low confidence/motivation. The traditional approach would be to send them to an assertiveness course and hope this addresses the issue. In the short-term, the employee learns new strategies for communicating which may improve confidence. Unfortunately, in isolation these courses rarely produce a sustained increase in confidence. Although external behaviour may change; it needs to be supported by changes in their internal thought processes. This is often where coaching is most effective.

Managers should not underestimate the impact of coaching on their people as it frequently creates a fundamental shift in their approach to their work. For example, increased self-confidence enables employees to bring more of themselves into the workplace. This results in employees being more resilient and assertive.

The Benefits of Coaching in Organizations:

- Empowers individuals and encourages them to take responsibility.
- Increases employee and staff engagement.
- Improves individual performance.
- Helps identify and develop high potential employees.
- Helps identify both organizational and individual strengths and development opportunities.
- Helps to motivate and empower individuals to excel.
- Demonstrates organizational commitment to the wellbeing of employees.

2. SCOPE OF WORK: REQUIREMENT / SPECIFICATION

The WRC requires to appoint a coaches for the provision couching services for employees.

The appointed Service Provider/s are to provide the following services

- Six (6) one-hour sessions for each employee in the coaching programme
- Four (4) accredited Master coachers (Executive)
- Thirty (30) accredited Expert level Coaches
- Number of employees to be coached: thirty-four (34) employees
- All coaches must be accredited Consciousness Coaches, and must use the conscious coaching methodology in their coaching sessions with WRC employees.

3. EVALUATION PHASES

The received proposals will be evaluated in different phases in order to arrive to the final phase of bid award, and the phases will be as follows:

- 3.1 Phase One Screening of the minimum requirements documents
- 3.2 Phase Two Pre-qualification evaluation

3.1 Phase One (01): Screening of the minimum requirements documents

In this phase All bids received will be verified for compliance and completeness of the submitted proposal per the below set of mandatory requirements. Bidders who fail to comply with the below requirements may be eliminated and bidders who comply with the below progresses to the next phase of technical evaluation.

- Submission of fully completed SBD8 (Declaration of Bidders Past SCM Practice),
- Submission of fully completed SBD9 (Certificate of Independent Bid Determination),
- Submission of Central Supplier Database (CSD) Compliance History Report.

NB: Any bidders who did not sign and submit any of the requested documents may be disqualified.

3.2 Phase Two (2): Pre-qualification Evaluation phase

Service providers / coaches are required to submit the below listed requirements in order to comply with Phase two (2) of the evaluation; failure to comply with the pre-qualification shall lead to immediate elimination. Only bidders who complied with the listed requirements will proceed to the next phase of evaluation.

- Coaches must be accredited Consciousness Coaches. Failure to submit proof of accreditation will lead to elimination.
- ➤ Couches must use the conscious coaching methodology in the coaching sessions with the WRC employees. Failure to comply with the prescribed methodology will lead to elimination.
- Couches should be able to provide proof of coaching experience as per the hours indicated below:
