PART D TERMS OF REFERENCE / SCOPE OF WORK

1. BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

The WRC operates as legislated by the Water Research Act (Act 34 of 1971) and is an entity of national importance to ensure water security, support to the DWS and water sector stakeholders through funding of research entities (universities, consultants and SMMEs). The Primary Function of the WRC is to (1) Promote coordination, cooperation, and communication in water research; (2) Establish water research needs and priorities; (3) Stimulate and fund water research according to priority; (4) Promote the effective transfer of information and technology; and (5) Enhance knowledge and capacity building within the water sector.

The South African Sanitation Technology Enterprise Programme (SASTEP), which operates from the offices of the Water Research Commission, is a national system of innovation platform that seeks fast-track the adoption of innovative and emerging sanitation technologies in South Africa through fostering local manufacturing and commercialisation. SASTEP requires the services of a virtual reality service provider to create a virtual reality experience to demonstrate the various sites that the programme currently has.

The programme is requesting proposals from qualified virtual reality (VR) experience developers to design and deliver VR interactive experiences to showcase three (3) sanitation technologies from the programme. Many of the technologies on the SASTEP platform are large and cannot be transported to conferences, workshops, roadshows, and other physical events. We are therefore seeking the use of VR experience to give our stakeholders an "in-person" experience/interaction with some of the innovative sanitation technologies the programme is promoting.

The WRC requires the services of a reputable and qualified company to design and deliver virtual reality (VR) experience.

2. SCOPE OF WORK: REQUIREMENT / SPECIFICATION

We hereby request a virtual reality service provider to propose various means of achieving the requirement stated below. As a minimum, the requirement includes:

- 360° view 3D high-resolution video that allows movement within the VR environment and interaction with elements within the virtual space i.e., being able to take a VR virtual tour of sites, touch buttons, open doors, interact with characters within the virtual space.
- 360° view 3D animated video with voice-over and text description for the process flow of different unit operations that make up the sanitation technology unit.
- Preloaded instructions, interviews, and interaction with characters within the technologies' locality e.g., community leaders, Janitors, users, and others.
- 360° view 3D animated interactive video Interactive VR virtual tour beneficial to the virtual reality experience.
- Animation of the back-end treatment system that allows the user to understand the unit operation process.
 - Other Requirements
- Training from service provider to SASTEP end users on how to use the equipment



- The output/experience should be technology/platform agnostic i.e., it should not be locked into the use of one technology or service provider.
- Should be compatible with current and future VR Platform
- Web based versions of the 360° videos, animation, interviews etc.
- Hosting and other ancillary support services
- Proposer to recommend hardware that will optimizes user experience of VR environment.

Hardware

The following hardware are indicative only, proposer to include hardware that optimizes user experience of VR environment. Hardware cost should be included in stage gate 2. Successfully proposer shall provide necessary hardware to assess and evaluate the output during Stage Gate1.

- Apple TV 4K HD TV 6th Gen 32GB— compatible hardware for carrying to exhibitions or equivalent (x2)
- Oculus quest 2 Advanced All-In-One VR headset 256 GB or equivalent (x2)
- Apple iPad 9th Generation 256GB Tablet (x2) 2 x Tablets (256GB) best suited to solution or equivalent

Hosting and other ancillary support services

• Quotation to include hosting, support and other services that would enable the smooth running and optimal user experience of both the VR and the web-based versions. This should be included in the stage Gate 2 scope of work. Hosting and support duration should be for 36 months.

Stage Gate Approach

The proposer is required to provide quotations in stage gates. A total of 3 technologies and sites will require VR developmental work. To manage the risks of outputs not meeting expectations, the proposer will be required to build a virtual reality environment for only one technology during Stage Gate 1. After this is assessed and reviewed, and if it meets the expectation of the project owner, only then would Stage Gate 2 be initiated - VR development work for the other 2 technologies.

Stage Gate 1 scope

This should include quotation required to deliver on the VR development and web-based for one sanitation technology. This will include work required to deliver the full requirement for one sanitation technology. This is essentially proof of concept and should exclude other requirements such as hardware, hosting support, and should only include necessary requirements to allow end-user to assess the output of Stage Gate 1.

Stage Gate 2 scope

Stage Gate 2 will include developmental work for the other 2 sanitation technologies and the full deployment of the 3 technologies on the selected platform. This will include hardware, hosting, and support for the platform for the 3 sanitation technologies.

Quotation should be split into stage gates as explained above. Evaluation will be based on total scope and pricing.

 submit their bids. This session is to ensure that service providers have a clear understanding of what is
 required from them.

4. EVALUATION PHASES

The received proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the PPPFA and evaluated in different phases in order to arrive to the final phase of bid award, and the phases will be as follows:

- 4.2. Phase two: stage 1– Technical/functionality evaluation criteria Phase two: stage 2 Verbal presentation evaluation.
- 4.3. Phase three Specification compliance
- 4.4. Phase four Price and Preference (Specific goals)
- 4.5. Phase 5: Due Diligence

4.1 Phase One (1): Screening of the minimum requirements documents
