- Water quality and health This thematic area drives integrated research and innovation to generate knowledge, insights and data to inform the establishment of appropriate healthbased targets and thresholds for different water uses.
- Water advisory support This thematic area seeks to support extension services and strengthen capacity building instruments through support for centres of excellence, communities of practice, Research Chairs and advisory panels across the local to national level.
- Knowledge services RDI-generated products must reach the WRC's target audience at different levels of expertise.
 The Commission is creating specific knowledge dissemination methods and strengthening existing tools to cater for the knowledge and information needs of its stakeholders.

ABOUT THE WRC

The WRC of South Africa was established in terms of the Water Research Act (Act No. 34 of 1971) following a period of serious water shortage. Today, the WRC continues to serve the country as South Africa's largest funder of water and sanitation-related research. In addition, the Commission serves as the research and development partner of the sector leader, the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS), and provides the sector with knowledge and capacity to ensure sustainable management of water resources and enhance water services. Funding is received through water research levies as well as leverage funding from research partners, international donors and foundations.





The WRC achieves is objectives through five key actions, namely:

- Promoting cooperation, coordination and communication between stakeholders in the area of water research and development
- Establishing water research needs and priorities
- Stimulating and funding water research according to priority
- Promoting the effective transfer of information and technology
- Enhancing knowledge and capacity building in the water sector
